Categories (50+. Senior, U21, U18)

Archers: EARLY BIRD until April 30th - \$110; from May 1 to June 7 - \$130

Archers: Optional 720 round \$30

Coaches: \$25

Archers must declare their participation in the Mixed Team at the time of registration.

Banquet: \$60 to be held at the Mandarin Restaurant in Brampton, near the hotel.

Kids 5-12 \$30. Kids 4 and under are free. Prices include taxes and gratuity.

EVENT PURPOSE, ELIGIBILITY & RULES

The Canada Cups were developed to:

- promote and increase regional competition for Archery in Canada
- serve as a celebration of the sport of Archery and its community
- provide an athlete centered environment that enables competitive personal best performances
- potentially serve as one of the recognized criteria for International event selection and Athlete and coach identification
- provide an opportunity for developing archers to participate in team rounds

The Canada Cup East consists of one (1) 720 Target qualification round, Individual Match Play, and Mixed Team Match Play. The 720 Qualification round will be used to determine the archers qualifying positions for Individual Elimination Matchplay, as well as their team assignments for the Team Match Play. An option second 720 round is included for interested archers.

Mixed Team: 1 Male, 1 Female for Recurve and Compound. All Ages classes can register in a team, but all shoot at senior distances (Compound = 50m/Recurve 70m) - No additional Fee.

The Canada Cup will be open to the following Age and Equipment Classes:

- Recurve Men and Women – U18 to 50+ Age Classes
- Compound Men and Women – U18 to 50+ Age Classes
- Barebow Men and Women – U18 to 50+ Age Classes

All Coaches must be licensed according to Archery Canada requirements.

CHECK IN, ACCREDITATION & INSPECTION

Registration Check-In followed by Equipment Inspection is required by all archers, coaches and team managers on the first day of the championships prior to the start of competition.

Athlete Accreditation (Athlete numbers)

Athletes will receive an athlete number card which shall be proof of accreditation and must be worn visibly at all times while on the field of play. Athlete numbers will remain unchanged throughout the tournament.

Coach Accreditation

All coaches will receive an accreditation lanyard which must be always worn on the field of play. Only coaches with Archery Canada issued 2024 Coach Technical License are eligible for Coach accreditation. Exceptions for US Archery validation or other World Archery Member Association validation for coaches may be requested from Archery Canada.

Athlete Agent (Para)

Volunteers (local volunteers, spectators or chaperones) will be available to assist and act as a scoring agent as well as to assist with arrow retrieval. Athletes may have their own agent, and should identify them as such upon registration. The agents will be provided Field of Play accreditation.

WEATHER

In Brampton in early June the average temperature is expected to be from 14°C to 25°C. There is a possibility of rain in early to mid-June.


